We are honored to have an outstanding speaker, Howard Suber, PhD and Emeritus Professor, from the UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television who will discuss "Why the World Loves American Films," for our Arts & Culture series.

Howard Suber has been a faculty member at the UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television for over 50 years where he has taught more than 65 different film courses and provided administrative leadership in the development of the internationally recognized film program. When he retired 25 years ago he was immediately called back by popular demand to teach part-time.

He has been a consultant to all of the major Hollywood studios and some television networks, mostly dealing with issues of copyright and creative control.

Suber has been awarded UCLA's Distinguished Teaching Award, the UCLA Dickson Emeriti Professorship Award and life achievement awards from two American film festivals. A team of his former students are currently involved in developing a TV series featuring Howard's ideas about what makes American films memorable and popular.

"WAR PAINT" MUSICAL OPENS ON BROADWAY

Ann Carol Grossman '69 and Arnie Reisman '64 knew they had a story that needed to be told: At a time when few women ran businesses, cosmetics pioneers Helena Rubinstein and Elizabeth Arden created an industry, but their ambition was matched only by their rivalry. Both arrived in the United States as immigrants with little resources, but went on to help build what is today a \$150 billion global health and beauty industry. Rubinstein and Arden were fierce rivals for more than 50 years and never met in person, although they lived and worked only a few blocks apart. It was a



drama worthy of Broadway, and soon, thanks to these two Brandeis alumni, that's exactly where it will be, beginning next month.

Grossman and Reisman first connected when they served together on Brandeis' Student Media Advisory Committee in the early 1990's. "It's like we share a brain," says Grossman, citing their common point of view as a possible result of both being Brandeisians of the '60's. In the ensuing years, Grossman and Reisman worked together on several projects, specializing in short films for nonprofit organizations.

In conducting research, they discovered the book "War Paint" by Lindy Woodhead, and reached an agreement with the author to use her book as source material for a documentary. In 2009, "The Powder & the Glory" premiered on PBS, where it has since become a Women's History Month staple.

At the suggestion of Grossman's then-teenage daughter, who saw its stage potential, it opened April 6 on Broadway as a musical under the name, "War Paint." Book is by Doug Wright, with music by Scott Frankel, and lyrics by Michael Korie, based both on Lindy Woodhead's 2004 book "War Paint" and on the 2007 documentary film "The Powder & the Glory."

Looking back both alumni credit their alma mater with shaping their identities and career paths, fueling the inquisitive minds that made projects like "The Powder & the Glory" possible. "Brandeis in the '60's was an amazing incubator of courage and creativity," says Reisman. "I came there as a budding independent spirit, and Brandeis taught me how to fly."
