

Exploring Jewish Thought Through Food

Summers at Brandeis are anything but quiet!

Genesis, a pre-college program, brings high school students from around the world to campus to take experiential-learning classes that explore Jewish thought, culture and identity. One class, "Discovering the Art and Anthropology of Jewish Food," taught by Elizabeth Alpern and Jeffrey Yoskowitz, encourages students to learn basic culinary skills while thinking critically about the role food has played in the formation of their Jewish identity.

High school student Betsy, from Chicago, made her grandmother's recipe for chocolateorange cookies in class. Betsy talked about the role this recipe (from a cookbook) plays in her family. She said her grandmother is the hostess of their large (15 to 25 people) family. And that she loves sharing her ideas and her recipes.

For Betsy's Bat Mitzvah her grandmother made all kinds of cookies that people helped themselves to throughout the afternoon. And Grandma was delighted that Betsy was sharing this recipe with the class.

According to the teachers of the class, food connects us to the people we love. It builds community in kitchens (and classrooms) across the world.

CHOCOLATE-ORANGE COOKIES

Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees.
Stir together these dry ingredients:
2 ½ cups all-purpose flour
1 tsp. baking powder
¼ tsp. salt
Then melt 8 oz. bittersweet chocolate and cool;
Chop 4 oz. chocolate, finely.


In separate bowl, add: 2 cups light brown sugar 8 oz. unsalted butter, room temperature 2/3 cup unsweetened cocoa 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract 2 tsp. finely-grated orange zest Mix on medium-speed for 4 minutes

Add: Finely-chopped chocolate 3 eggs (beat batter after each addition) Cooled chocolate Dry ingredients Mix at low speed. Scoop up batter with ice cream scoop; roll scooped dough into a ball with hands. Lightly dip one side in flour for top of cookie. Place on baking sheet; Bake 11 minutes, then sprinkle with sugar. Cool 5 minutes; Serve.

Nobelist Sparks Laughter With Lab Joke

With characteristic envelope-pushing humor, Michael Rosbash, winner of the 2017 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine, couldn't help dropping a joke into a press conference Monday morning about the life of a scientist.

In the library of Brandeis University, where he has taught for over 40 years, Rosbash told a packed crowd of colleagues, university administrators and students – and an untold number of viewers watching the live stream – about a Frenchman, an Englishman, and a scientist who were pondering whether it would be better to have a wife or a mistress.

After the Frenchman and the Englishman disagreed on the relative merits of the two, the scientist weighed in.

"The scientist said, 'No, no, you need them both, because after dinner you can tell your wife you're with your mistress, and you can tell your mistress you're with your wife. And then you can go back to the lab!" Rosbash said, to much laughter.

Rosbash's colleagues say the joke was indicative of his temperament: serious about science – and about making people laugh.

Rosbash's prize was shared with Jeffrey Hall and the Rockefeller University scientist Michael Young. The three discovered genetic mechanisms that govern the circadian rhythm, the day-long cycle that governs metabolism, hormones, brain activity and many other processes in animals and humans.
