

AUTHOR, SPEAKER AND ACTIVIST TALIA CARNER *"THE VOICES THAT WOULDN'T BE SILENCED"*

In the late 1800s-early 1900s, against the poverty, persecution and pogroms in Eastern Europe, the lure of "America" was exploited by members of Zwi Migdal—a legal traffickers' union that operated with impunity in South America for 70 years! An estimated 150,000 Jewish girls and women fell for false promises of jobs and marriages—only to be forced into prostitution. In her speech, author Talia Carner will reveal how the cries of these women, also shunned by the Jewish community, forced her to expose the most shameful chapter in our history. She will also speak to the dynamics of modern sextrafficking in the U.S. today and how we can end this evil in our own backyards.

Talia Carner is the former publisher of *Savvy Woman* magazine, a lecturer at international women economic forums, and an award-winning author of five novels, each dealing with a social issue. In THE THIRD DAUGHTER (HarperCollins, September 2019) she takes a cue from Sholem Aleichem's story, "The Man from Buenos Aires" and reinvents the story of one of Tevye's daughters after the family flees a pogrom and meets a mysterious, shady man.

Hope this bulletin finds you well and safe. The Board and I hope you all had a wonderful Hanukkah and wish you a Happy and Healthy New Year!


