## Carole Bayer Sager

For five decades, Grammy and Academy Award–winning songwriter Carole Bayer Sager has been among the most admired and successful of her craft, responsible for her lyrical contributions to some of the most popular songs in the English language, including "Nobody Does It Better," "A Groovy Kind of Love," "Don't Cry Out Loud," and the Oscar-winning theme from the movie Arthur, "The Best That You Can Do." She has collaborated with (and written for) a dizzying number of stars, including Peter Allen, Ray Charles, Celine Dion, Bob Dylan, Neil Diamond, Clint

Eastwood, Kenny "Babyface" Edmonds, Aretha Franklin, Whitney Houston, Michael Jackson, Carole King, Melissa Manchester, Reba McEntire, Bette Midler, Dolly Parton, Carly Simon, Frank Sinatra, and Barbra Streisand. Carole has written more than 400 songs. She has received an Oscar, two Golden Globe Awards, and a com-

bined fifteen nominations, including a Grammy win for Song of the Year, for "That's What Friends Are For." Her relationship with composer Marvin Hamlisch was the basis of the long-running hit musical, They're Playing Our Song, for which she wrote the lyrics. Her work with composer Burt Bacharach, to whom she was also married for ten years, produced pop standards such as "On My Own" and "That's What Friends Are For" (inspired by her friendship with Elizabeth Taylor), which raised over two million dollars for AIDS research. Her Oscar-nominated and Golden Globe-winning song "The Prayer," which she wrote with David Foster, was originally recorded by Celine Dion and Andrea Bocelli, and is one of the few songs to be sung at both weddings and funerals. Carole also co-wrote half of the songs used in in the Broadway musical "The Boy From Oz," which starred Hugh Jackman and told the story of Peter Allen's life.

In October 2016, Carole released her New York Times best-selling memoir, They're Playing Our Song. In it, Carole tells the surprisingly frank and darkly humorous story of a woman whose sometimes crippling fears and devastating relationships inspired many of the songs she would ultimately write. They're Playing Our Song will fascinate anyone interested in the craft of songwriting and the joy of collaboration, but Carole's memoir is also a deeply personal account of how love and heartbreak made her the woman, and the writer, she is.

She is a member of the Songwriter's Hall of Fame and was awarded a Star on The Hollywood Walk of Fame. She lives in Los Angeles with her husband, Robert Daly, and shares their bed with three unruly dogs who are unimpressed with their accomplishments.

## Jonathan Shapíro

Jonathan Shapiro has spent the last 17 years writing and producing some of television's most iconic shows, including The Blacklist, The Practice, Life, and Boston Legal. An Emmy, Peabody, and Humanitas Awards winner, he and David E. Kelley are the creators and executive producers of the Goliath, a legal thriller on Amazon Prime, winner of the 2017 Golden Globe Award for Best Actor in a Television Drama, Billy Bob Thornton. In addition to his work in television, he is also the author of two recent books: the memoir "Liars, Lawyers, and the Art of Storytelling" (ABA Publishing) and the novel "Deadly Force" (Ankerwycke Press).

Prior to becoming a full-time writer and producer, Jonathan spent a decade as a federal prosecutor and as an adjunct law professor at Loyola Law School and the University of Southern

California's Gould School of Law. He is a member and the former chairman of the California Commission on Government Economy and Efficiency, as well as the founder and director of the Public Counsel Emergency for Torture Victims.

Shapiro is a graduate of Harvard University, a Rhodes Scholar at Oriel College, Oxford University, and received his law degree from the University of California, Berkeley. He is married to Brandeis alum and television writer/producer Betsy Borns (Roseanne, Friends, All of Us). They have three children: Abraham, Sarah and Ezekiel.

### Gína B. Nahaí

Gina Nahai is a best-selling author, columnist, and emeritus professor of Creative Writing at USC. Her novels have been translated into eighteen languages, and have been finalists for the Orange Award, the IMPAC Award, the Harold J. Ribalow Award, and the Jewish Book Council's Fiction Award. She is the winner of the Los Angeles Arts Council Award, the Persian Heritage Foundation's Award, The Simon Rockower Award, and the Phi Kappa Phi Award. Her writings have appeared in numerous national and international publications, as well as in a number of literary and academic journals and anthologies. She writes a monthly column for the Jewish Journal of Greater Los Angeles, and is a three-time finalist for an LA Press Club award. Nahai holds a BA and a Masters degree in International Relations from UCLA, and

a Master of Professional Writing from USC. Her latest novel, The Luminous Heart of Jonah S., was a finalist for the Jewish Book Council's fiction award in 2014, and long-listed for the Dublin International Literary Award.

## Eítan Arom, Moderator

Eitan Arom is a Jewish Journal staff writer focusing on local politics, civic life, Yiddish culture, Holocaust history, religious practice and much more. Eitan grew up in the Los Angeles area, attending Beverly Hills High School and graduating in 2014 from UCLA, where he worked for the Daily Bruin as a weekly columnist and opinion editor. Afterward, he began his professional journalism career in Israel as a reporting intern for the Jerusalem Post. Returning to the United States, he worked as a Capitol Hill reporter and moved back to L.A. to work as a freelance writer covering Jewish issues before joining the Jewish Journal as a staff writer in May 2016.

### **ISRAELI FLAG HAS AMERICAN ROOTS**

As early as 1891, 57 years before the founding of the modern State of Israel, a prototype of today's Israeli flag was created and displayed in Boston's North End – a flag that would eventually be one of several significant influences on Israel's present-day flag.

"American Jews and the Flag of Israel," by Brandeis professor of American Jewish history Jonathan Sarna, '75, MA '75, reveals a rich new chapter in the long history of deep ties between the United States and Israel that had previously gone largely untold. Sarna's research underscores the depth, role and influence of the United States in the earliest days of the Zionist movement.

Sarna's findings were presented last December to Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu in Jerusalem by Brandeis University President Ron Liebowitz, who also presented Netanyahu with a replica of the 1892 version of the flag that was hung more than a century ago at Zion Hall, Boston.

The flag was designed by Rabbi Jacob Baruch Askowith, a Lithuanian Jew, seven years after his arrival in Boston. A flag of the same design would later be displayed at the 2nd Zionist Congress in Basel, Switzerland. This design is believed to have played an influential role in the development of the flag that was ultimately adopted by the State of Israel.

"Brandeis University has deep historic bonds with Israel, beginning with our namesake Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis, one of the most prominent American supporters of Jewish statehood," President Leibowitz said.

### **STUDY GROUP CORNER** THE YEAR OF THE STUDY GROUP: 1956

A year to be remembered, 1956 was The Year of the Study Group, a concept that would be the hallmark of the Brandeis National Committee's identity and appeal.

Members of the Brandeis faculty were asked to write a syllabus – with a bibliography – and to think of the undertaking in terms of continuing education that would provide the stimulation of a classroom in a private home. The study groups began modestly, and in the first year, 16 chapters (out of 89) participated. Later topics would span all areas of the arts, the sciences, the humanities and the social sciences. There would be hundreds of syllabi, year after year, with new subjects introduced at every conference.

The Study Group Program is the single most attractive and relevant project in the history of the Brandeis National Committee. It is the reason many thousands of members joined, it's the reason many thousands renewed their memberships, and it is still a selling point for new members and for the creation of new chapters.

Today the Study Group program has extended far beyond the syllabi and includes special interest offerings in hundreds of fields.

Brandeis San Fernando Valley now has 81 Study Groups.
