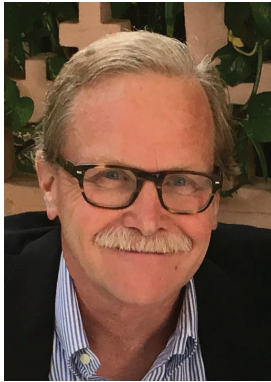

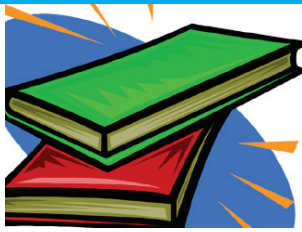

Brandeis Faculty Receive NEH Grants

Three Brandeis faculty members have received funding in a new round of grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities. A total of over \$200,000 in funding was received for separate projects by Brandeis professors Wendy Cadge, Karen Desmond and Ralph Thaxton.

Dr. Cadge received the grant to add to her previous research on Boston's Hidden Sacred Spaces. The project will fund a location based app for hidden chapels, meditation spaces and prayer rooms that people in Boston pass daily but few stop to closely consider.

Dr. Desmond's grant will fund the development of a web-based software prototype that will offer new possibilities for the analysis and interpretation of late medieval music.

And Professor Thaxton, professor of politics, will receive the grant to fund the completion of research and the writing of a book reassessing China's Great Famine from 1958 to 1962.

November 13, 1856 – Birthday of Louis D. Brandeis

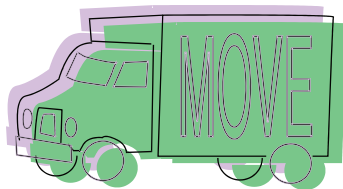
Nominated to the Supreme Court by President Woodrow Wilson, Louis Dembitz Brandeis was confirmed as the first Jewish Supreme Court Justice by a Senate vote of 47 – 22 on June 1, 1916. Brandeis was an associate justice on the U.S. Supreme Court from 1916 to 1939. He died in Washington, D.C. in 1941.

Brandeis President Shares Vision for the Future

Dr. Ron Liebowitz, President of Brandeis University, recently shared his vision for the future of the institution.

“Brandeis is at a vital crossroads in its short history. Despite seven decades of remarkable success and progress, our university has been in startup mode for far too long. Now is the time for us – students, faculty, staff, alumni, trustees, parents, and friends – to re-imagine the future of our institution.”

He has created “A Framework for our Future” that focuses on strengthening three priorities, each an essential pillar of the university:

“First, we will refine the student experience for both undergraduate and graduate students.

“Second, we will broaden and strengthen our research and scholarly capacity and impact beyond campus.

“Third, we will honor our founding values, including our connections to the American Jewish community.

“All of this will not be achieved in a year, or perhaps even under my presidency. But I believe that this vision, this framework, and these guideposts are what we need to chart the next 70 years of our university – together, as a community.”

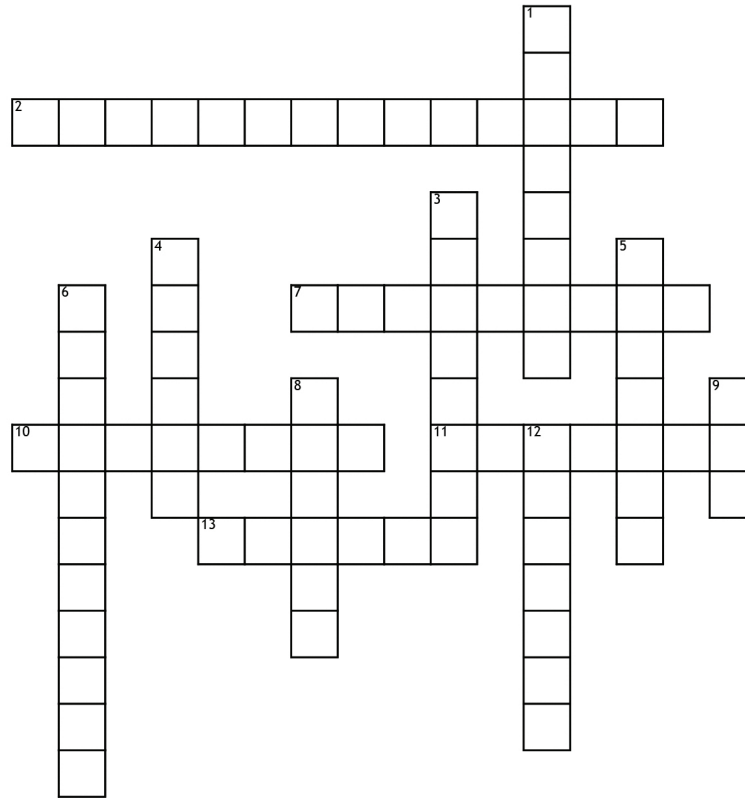
